Te Ora o Manukau-Manukau the Healthy City is a Ministry of Health **co-funded** partnership with the Manukau City Council.

Recommendation

To review the Foreshore and Seabed Act (2004) in particular, Sections 3 and 4(a) to ensure that Maori rights recognised in Tikanga, Te Tiriti o Waitangi and the Common Law are protected and enabled.

Conclusion

Te Ora o Manukau rejects the Crown's claim to overall ownership of the Foreshore and Seabed and asserts instead, that rights to the Foreshore and Seabed are inherent in Māori. The onus of ownership is on the Crown not Maori.

By referring to "public foreshore" the Act excludes areas that are already privately owned, most of which are in non-Maori hands. This is in conflict with politicians' comments about "one law for all" by creating a dishonest law that clearly reduces Maori rights and status to a lesser position.

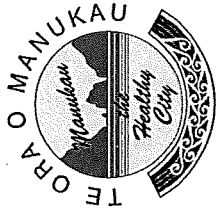
It is suggested that the Crown recognise Maori rights in return for which Maori guarantee access to the Foreshore and Seabed.

Vision

We, the signatories, are committed to improving quality of life and wellbeing for all Manukau people and to Te Tiriti o Waitangi, by working to make it a healthier place to live, work and play.

This includes a commitment to strengthening, fostering and supporting whānau, hapu and iwi development. We acknowledge the essential role of tino rangatiratanga and whānau ora in Māori health and wellbeing.

We support the goals of Tomorrow's Manukau – Manukau Āpōpō.

We uphold the World Health Organisation's global vision of 'Health for All' which has initiated and maintained Healthy Cities partnerships in Manukau since the first Charter was signed in 1989.

Te Ora o Manukau is a partner with Manukau the Healthy City. It is a collective of Māori committed to: whānau ora (*enhancing family health and wellbeing*), kotahitanga (*working collaboratively*), tikanga Māori (*preferred practice models for Māori*) and tino rangatiratanga (*by Māori, for Māori*).

This is the fourth Healthy City Charter.

- Work in partnerships, share resources and co-operate to protect and improve the health and wellbeing of the people of Manukau.
- Work to ensure that the policies and actions of our individual organisations contribute to that goal.
